

MOUSE'S CHRISTMAS COTTAGE SCARF



This scarf was inspired by the one worn by Jared Padalecki in the movie [Thomas Kinkadee's Home for Christmas](#). While watching the movie, my friend Mouse fell in love with it and expressed the desire to own a similar scarf. I couldn't say no and therefore got to work. This is the result. It's a super easy cable scarf and looks pretty nice once done, if I may say so myself. I think it's a great project for a first time knitting cables, too. 😊

MATERIALS:

- 8 skeins of Phildar's Partner 6 in Pavot (dark red)
- Size 9 (US) needles / 5.5 needles (EU)
- Cable needle (though you can use a double-pointed needle instead)

GAUGE:

Gauge isn't really important here. It's a scarf. The size will depend on whether you stick with the recommended yarn or switch to another bulkier or finer yarn. It's more a question of whether you want it wide or not, in which case you may adapt the number of stitches to get a result that suits your tastes.

GLOSSARY:

- CO – Cast On
- CN – Cable Needle
- K – Knit
- P – Purl
- [] x y – repeat the part of the pattern between brackets y number of times
- BO – Bind Off

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PATTERN:

CO 34

Rows 1 to 4: K34

Rows 5, 7, 9, 11 & 13: P2, [K6, P2] x 4

Rows 6, 8, 10, 12 & 14: P34

Cable rows:

Row 15: P2, K6, P2, slide 4 stitches onto CN and hold in front, K2, K4 from CN, P2, slide 2 stitches onto CN and hold in back, K4, K2 from CN, P2, K6, P2

Row 16: P34



Repeat rows 5 to 16 until the scarf is the right length for you, then Knit rows 5 to 14 one last time.

Knit all stitches for four rows then BO.

Weave in ends. Block.
